First Communion:

First Communion is a special sacrament that we help students prepare for. Students typically celebrate first communion during 2nd grade, but we also welcome older children that have not yet celebrated.

Preparation is a 2 year commitment and includes: class participation, reconciliation, parent meetings, attendance at Mass, and practice time. **A student must attend one year of classes here at Immaculate Conception prior to the year they will be celebrating a sacrament.**

The reason that we require a two consecutive year program is because celebrating a sacrament should involve becoming familiar and comfortable with our parish community. Class participation is an important part of our program. Students that attend our classes have the opportunity to meet peers and share their faith, work in small groups, become familiar with our facility, and take class visits to the church. They will also experience opportunities to meet our priest, develop relationships with catechists, learn how they can become involved volunteering at the church, and enjoy the benefits of a structured classroom setting.
